COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

During April, our Community Policing Team carried out joint work with partners, supported by our Community Speed Watch teams and specialist road teams. The work carried out, not only focused on reducing speeds and providing safety advice, but also saw checks on 297 vehicles.

This was to ensure vehicles were with their rightful owners, with the aim of reducing theft of vehicles and disrupting those responsible for these types of offences, which is also part of the work we are carrying out everyday to help keep our district a safe place to live and work.



DISTRICT STATISTICS



A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers have dealt with during March:

We helped to find 27 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We responded to 20 mental-health related incidents and worked with local partners to help those concerned get the help and support they needed.

We investigated 36 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 12 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 109 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 67 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We have submitted 198 pieces of intelligence which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 20 people within our district to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.
