During March, our Community Policing Team patrolled a variety of locations, engaging with our commercial partners, increasing our visible patrols, and taking time to speak to our communities.

We took time to provide our ever popular 'The Little book of Big Scams' to our residents, as we can only reduce offending by working together.

We were also supported by specialists from our Business Crime Team and positive action taken against a prolific Rochford shoplifter, James BUTCHER, resulted in 32-weeks imprisonment and a 5-year ban on entering several shops.






We have continued to be as visible as possible in key locations across the district. Focusing our patrols based on what we know, and what our community tells us.



DISTRICT STATISTICS



A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers have dealt with during March:

We helped to find 27 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We responded to 20 mental-health related incidents and worked with local partners to help those concerned get the help and support they needed.

We investigated 36 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 12 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 109 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 67 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We have submitted 198 pieces of intelligence which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 20 people within our district to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.

Fraudsters are calling people pretending to be from the bank, advising a fraudulent payment on your card has been spotted, or it needs to be replaced. Asking you to read out your PIN or type it on your phone keypad. Then promising to arrange a courier to collect your bank card.

Your bank will never call you to ask you to verify personal details or PIN by phone. They would never offer to pick up your card by a courier.
