COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

During December, we were supported across the Rochford district by both our Rural Engagement Team and our Roads Policing Officers.

Their work focused around Stambridge, Great Wakering, Hockley, Rochford and Ashingdon areas.

Checks of over 200 vehicles, resulted with 5 drivers being reported for speeds of up to 54mph in 30mph residential areas.

PS Willsher of the Roads Policing Team, stated "Educating, and where required prosecuting drivers, who are putting others at risk, is an important part of our work as we strive towards our vision of zero deaths on our roads in the future".



DISTRICT STATISTICS



A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers have dealt with during December:

We helped to find 36 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We responded to 37 mental-health related incidents and worked with local partners to help those concerned get the help and support they needed.

We investigated 22 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 28 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 117 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 43 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We have submitted 139 pieces of intelligence which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 35 people within our district to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.

Always consider checking the seller or buyer's review history and feedback from other reviewers.
